



Sam Stevens Obituary

November 13, 1941 - October 10, 2007

Mr. Sam Stevens, 65, of Albany died October 10, 2007 at Emory University Hospital in Atlanta. The Funeral Service will be Saturday, October 13, 2007, 11 AM at First United Methodist Church. Rev. Mike McAfee, Rev. Tami Coleman, Rev. Jim Coleman and Mr. Phil Gresham officiating. A native of Atlanta, GA, Mr. Stevens has lived in Albany since 1973 where he started Albany Safety Equipment Co. with Howard Garwood and was Secretary-Treasurer and General Manager from 1973 to 2003. After he sold the business, he became the Publications Director at Deerfield-Windsor School. Mr. Stevens was a member of First United Methodist Church where he served as an Adult Sunday School class teacher, Wednesday night supper coordinator, Disciple Bible Facilitator, and Chairman of the Board of Trustees, and on various committees. He was a member of Pine Forest Racquet Club. He also was a United States Navy Veteran. He graduated from O'Keefe High School in Atlanta and from Georgia State University with a Bachelor of Business Administration degree. Survivors include his wife, Carolyn F. Stevens, a daughter, Marlene Stevens Rinker and her husband David Rinker of Suwanee, GA, a son Paul Samuel Stevens, Jr. and his wife Tonya Egan of Salt Lake City, UT and a granddaughter, Maisie Jean Stevens of Salt Lake City, UT.
