



Sara Ann Sanford Arthur Obituary

Sara Ann Sanford Arthur, 74, of Leesburg died Monday at Phoebe Putney Memorial Hospital. The funeral service will be 11 AM Saturday at Kimbrell-Stern Funeral Directors with interment to follow in Leesburg City Cemetery. Rev. Ben Rice and Rev. John Warren will officiate. She was born in Macon, GA to the late Eugene and Sara Hightower Sanford but lived most of her life in Leesburg. She was a life long member of Leesburg Presbyterian Church, Golden Key Club member, XYZ member at Porterfield United Memorial Methodist Church and was a "special lady" that dearly loved her family and had a heart for children. She taught thousands of children to swim; she ran the best full day camp programs with the YMCA, the Recreation Departments and at her own home backyard. Mrs. Arthur taught children to have fun by playing volleyball, swimming, fishing, horseback riding, arts and crafts, floating down the river and even jumping on the trampoline. She had a great love for horses and in 1978 she and her horse won the World Cutting Horse Championship in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. She was deeply loved by all who knew her, and she was a legend. Survivors include her husband of more than 55 years, Sam P. Arthur of Leesburg, son Sandy Arthur of Santa Fe, New Mexico, daughter, Brandy Lee Arthur of Macon GA, 8 grandchildren: Sam C. Arthur, Sara A. Sena, Eugene A. Arthur, Joseph M. Arthur, George S. Arthur, Jalila Ann Arthur, Liberty Chamberlain, and Justus Chamberlain, 2 great-grandchildren, a nephew and several nieces and their children. She was preceded in death by her parents and a brother Raleigh Sanford. The family

“ The newspaper articles mentioned her positive attitude and her love of children, which were absolutely true, but she was so much more than those two things. She was a life force-- in the days before people spoke of multi-tasking, Miss Sara Ann could settle a little girl argument on the trampoline, get little boys lingering too long in the outhouse back outside, supervise the set up of balloons on a haybale for archery, keep an eye on the goings on on the other side of the pool and the tree house, and all this while mixing plaster for crafts later in the afternoon. This was in the summers with day camp in full swing. I remember equally well, her reflective side, especially as I got older and she would tell me the real history of how things got to be certain ways in the neighborhood and in the county. I remember her willingness to speak well of others and tell stories that reflected people's generosity and strengths, where others might have looked at their weaknesses. She didn't tell all she knew, but she did seem to take the good with the bad, choosing to focus on the good in each situation. She also had a wonderful sense of humor and was blessed in being able to laugh at things and get other people to join in her humor.
