“ To Chip and Sara's family- I never had the pleasure of knowing Sara on a personal level nor through our roles in the tourism industry, but I did have the opportunity to meet her, and Chip, in person when we were both being treated at MD Anderson in the fall of 2007. Being so far away from our Georgia homes and families made fighting our cancer battles difficult at times. So, the chance to meet someone from your own home state provided such a sense of comfort while journeying the tough road we both were traveling. What an unexpected blessing and a true example of divine intervention our chance meeting was! We met sitting in a diagnostic clinic waiting room at a hospital that takes up the size of almost 17 blocks in downtown Houston, TX. My husband and I sat together waiting on our names to be called out and in walked this couple...my eyes were immediately drawn to this masked woman's face...her eyes seemed familiar and yet surely, I couldn't know this woman. And then I saw Chips face, and realized that it was indeed the Sara Underdown that I had heard was also battling with cancer, a sister in tourism who I had been told about and read about on her caringbridge webpage. I recognized them from their caringbridge photos they had posted. I quietly watched them enter the room and as they both sat down, their backs facing ours, I reached out my hand to introduce myself to her and tell her who I was. I remember her first words to me, "How did you recognize me with my hat and mask on?" We shared our cancer war stories, talked about our families, and shared just a brief moment with each other. I consider myself lucky to have met her...even though I couldn't see her smile through her hospital mask, her eyes provided a warmth that lit up that waiting room. I never again had the opportunity to have that chance meeting with her again...our frequent visits for doctor check-ups and treatments never happened at the same time again. I continued to check on her progress thanks to the constant updates on her webpage and through Albany CVB friends. I was saddened to hear of her passing and my heart aches for her Chip, her family, her parents and her friends. I know it is not for us to understand why God chooses to call us home when He does. I know hearing the words "she is no longer in pain and she isn't suffering" doesn't

provide much comfort. The reality of knowing that Sara is no longer here with us is difficult to process, to accept, to understand...especially after such a long and brave battle she courageously fought. Her spirit throughout her journey remained so remarkably positive, hopeful and uplifting! May knowing that Sara touched the lives of so many, in such a positive and enlightening way, bring you a sense of peace and joy to your heart. Sara was an amazing and unwavering example of someone who loved her God, had faith that He would never take her to a place that she couldn't overcome and get through. Sara and her sweet spirit will forever live on. My deepest sympathy to her loved ones.
