



Sidney Wyche Haynes Obituary

November 18, 1933 - March 29, 2011

A native of Thomasville, GA, Mr. Haynes has lived in Albany 52 years where he was a charter member of Central Baptist Church and served as deacon and was chairman of various committees. Sidney and his wife June was the first couple to be married at Central Baptist Church 51 years ago. Mr. Haynes was retired from the United States Postal Service with 40 years of service. He served in the United States Navy during the Korean conflict. Mr. Haynes was a self taught artist having received a teaching certificate in oil and floral painting from the Bob Ross Workshop and was a member of the Albany Artist Guild. He was a graduate of Georgia Southwestern University where he majored in French and English. He attended Florida State University and was a member of the FSU Circus, where he performed Adagio Acrobatics and Figure Skating acts. He also attended Emory University, where he studied Theology. Mr. Haynes was a very humble and unpretentious man who never boasted of his accomplishments, and always put others before himself. Especially his Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. Mr. Haynes will always be remembered for the love and devotion he gave to his family, especially his loving wife of 51 years. Survivors include his wife June Haynes of Albany, son, Kem Haynes of Albany, granddaughter and the apple of his life, Whitney Haynes of Atlanta, brothers and sisters in law, Doug and Linda Tomlinson of Athens, Kitty Tomlinson of Albany and Dennis and Sondra Tomlinson of Leesburg, nephews, Jason, Chad and Dennie Tomlinson and his best friend "Max" his Yorkie.
