Stephen John Arneson, 69, of Leesburg, died Sunday, January 18, 2009 in Panama City Beach, FL. The graveside service will be held at 11 AM Thursday at Crown Hill Cemetery with Military Honors. The Rev. Connie Bramlett will officiate. Mr. Arneson was born in LaCrosse, WI, he grew up in Albany. He graduated from Albany High School in 1957. Mr. Arneson served in the United States Army with a tour in Korea. He received his MBA in Economics from the University of Georgia and then did further graduate work at Florida State University. Mr. Arneson was an Associate Professor of Economics at Albany Junior College. He was a charter member of Lutheran Church of Our Savior and the Albany Sertoma Club. Mr. Arneson was preceded in death by his father, Major O. Arneson. He is survived by his loving wife, Joann Roark Arneson of Leesburg; his mother, Lydia Arneson of Albany; a sister, Carolyn Purrier and her husband Steve of Albany; two nieces, Jennifer Johnson and her husband Kevin of Macon, and Kimberly Purrier of Americus; three great-nieces, Abigail Johnson, Rebecca Johnson, and Kaitlyn Johnson, all of Macon; and special caregivers, Elaine Lee, Lutrica Ball, Patrick and Angela Wingfield, and Diane Deese.
