



Stephen C. von Schlichten Obituary

November 1, 1953 - January 15, 2005

Carl Stephen "Ebo" von Schlichten, 51, of Albany, died Saturday, January 15, 2005 at his residence. His funeral service will be THURSDAY 11 AM at St. Teresa's Catholic Church. The Rev. Frank Patterson will officiate. Mr. von Schlichten's remains will be cremated following the service and will be interred at Riverside Cemetery at a later date. Carl was born in Topeka, Kansas on November 1, 1953, and lived in Albany from the age of 5 until after his attendance at Albany Junior College, now Darton College. He attended St. Teresa's School, Merry Acres Junior High School, graduated from Westover High School in 1971, and attended Albany Junior College. He subsequently lived in southern California, Lake Tahoe, and Panama City, FL for a number of years and returned to Albany about ten years ago. He was employed primarily in the restaurant business and was also a talented entertainer. He was a member of St. Teresa's Catholic Church where he had formerly been a member of the Folk Choir. Carl is survived by his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Harold C. von Schlichten, Albany; 2 brothers: Richard von Schlichten and his wife Karen, Colorado Springs, CO, Paul von Schlichten, Albany; a sister: Maria Cristina von Schlichten, Oakland, CA; 2 nieces and a nephew: Jessica and Jennifer von Schlichten, John Paul von Schlichten and their mother Grace von Schlichten, all of Atlanta; and many other relatives and good friends. He was preceded in death by a sister: Anna Maria von Schlichten. A Rosary service will be recited at Kimbrell-Stern Wednesday 7 PM with visitation to follow till 8 PM.
