Mr. Ted W. Anderson, 78, passed away at Columbus, GA Mid Town Medical Center after an extended illness.

His memorial service will be held July 11, 2015, 11 am, at Red Oak Methodist Church Walnut, IL.

Mr. Anderson had lived in Albany since 1993 and was a member of the Porterfield Memorial United Methodist Church, active in Albany's Golden Kiwanis Club and was a member of Grand Island Golf Club.
