



## Thomas Carcelli Obituary

January 29, 1920 - January 15, 2004

A native of Struthers, OH, he had lived in Albany since 1953. Mr. Carcelli joined the United States Marine Corps in 1939, and he retired with the rank of Captain in 1959. After his military service, he joined the Albany Government Employees Federal Credit Union (now Heritage Bank) as a manager in 1963, and retired from there in 1982. He was a member of St. Teresa's Catholic Church, the Knights of Columbus, the Walter H. Burt American Legion Post 30, the VFW, and the Retired Officers Association. Mr. Carcelli was preceded in death by his wife Winnie Gray Carcelli and a grandson Tom Carcelli.
