



Mr. Toby Wallace Tucker

April 11, 1956 - February 7, 2015

Toby Wallace Tucker died on February 7, 2015, at his home in Dawson, Georgia. He was 58 years old. Visitation will be held at Kimbrell-Stern funeral home in Albany, Georgia, at 1:00 pm on March 7, 2015. A memorial service will follow at 2:00 pm and will be conducted by the Reverend Tom Pollock. The committal of his remains will take place following the service on his property at 1551 Sellers Road, Dawson, Georgia, 39842. All friends and family are invited to attend.

Toby was born on April 11, 1956, in Valdosta, Georgia, to Pattye Patterson and George Wallace Tucker. He grew up in Albany and was known and loved by the community and his many friends for his talents in woodworking and photographic artistry, his kind and gentle nature, and his intelligent sense of humor. He loved books and spending time surrounded by the nature of south Georgia, especially the beautiful countryside surrounding his home of the past two years in Dawson.
