



Mr. W.C. Bill Harman

W. C. "Bill" Harman, 90, of Albany, died Saturday, November 7, 2015 at Lee County Health Care.

His funeral service will be at 2 PM on Tuesday, November 10, 2015 at Sherwood Baptist Church. The interment will be private. The Rev. Tom Pollock and the Rev. Jim Jewell will officiate. The family will receive friends on Tuesday prior to the service at Sherwood Baptist Church beginning at 1 PM till the funeral hour.

Mr. Harman was born in Welch, WV, and had lived in Albany for many years. He was a Life Deacon at Sherwood Baptist Church where he served as the former director of the Adult Sunday School Department, and was a member of the Men's Adult Sunday School Class. Mr. Harman was an Army veteran of World War II and Korea. He was a member of the Gideon International where he served many years as the Memorial Bible Director. He was a Past President of the Mended Hearts and also served as its visiting chairman. Mr. Harman served on the Board of the American Heart Association and was Team Captain of the Heart Walk. He served on the Board of Trustees of Seasons Christian Care. He was also a volunteer for many years at Phoebe Putney Memorial Hospital. He was a Scottish Rite Mason and a member of the Shrine. Mr. Harman was preceded in death by his wife, Mildred R. Harman.
