William Thomas Jones, Jr., died Saturday, January 19, 2008, at his home. Services will be held Tuesday, January 22, 2008, at 11 AM at Crown Hill Cemetery. The Very Reverend Mark Jones will officiate. A lifetime native of Albany, Tom attend Albany schools and graduated from Deerfield in 1973. He graduated Magna Cum Laude from Georgia State University in 1978. He then entered Georgia Tech for postgraduate studies, where he also instructed in mathematics. After leaving Georgia Tech he was employed by the Federal Government's General Services Administration as a real estate specialist, later transferring to the Centers for Disease Control until he retired. He was preceded in death by his father, William Thomas Jones, Sr., and is survived by his mother, Polly DuVernet Jones, and cousins: Claudia Parker, Bucky and Anita Parker, Susan and Stuart Logan, Laura and Bill Harrell, all of Albany; Kay DuVernet of Newton, Diane and Tim Miller of Athens, Dia DuVernet and Pierce Tyler of Portsmouth, VA, Bob Parker of New Haven, CT, and Sallie Timmerman of Atlanta.
