



William I. Parker Obituary

May 26, 1918 - January 24, 2005

Born May 26, 1918, Bill Parker served as a fighter pilot with the 33rd Fighter Group, 59th Fighter Squadron during World War II, winning the Distinguished Flying Cross for missions in North Africa, Italy, China, Burma and India. He was employed in the building materials business in Albany for many years, retiring as Vice President of Watkins Builders Supply and was a member of St. Paul's Episcopal Church. Survivors include his daughter, Helen Claudia Parker of Albany, two sons, William Irwin Parker, Jr. of Albany, and Robert DuVernet Parker of New Haven, CT; a granddaughter, Lowery DuVernet Parker of Mirriah Niger, West Africa and two grandsons, Geoffery Fable Harris Parker, New Haven, CT and Cader Alexander Mebane Parker of Charlotte, NC.
