William Charles Philips Jr., 94, of Leesburg, GA passed away at his home Tuesday, October 24th. His funeral service will be held Saturday, October 28, 2017 at 3:00 PM at Crown Hill Mausoleum Chapel. Visitation will be held one hour prior to the service at 2:00 PM at Crown Hill Mausoleum Chapel. Entombment will be at the mausoleum with full military honors following the service. Rev. Doug Hudson, Pastor at Trinity Lutheran Church will officiate.

Charlie was born in Redan, GA on December 21, 1922, to Laddie and William C. Philips, Sr. He enlisted in the U.S. Navy and served his country during WWII, participating in the Invasion of Normandy. After the war ended, he returned home and married the love of his life, Jean Lee.

Since Charlie retired, he dedicated his time to serving his community. He had the honor of receiving the prestigious Exchange Club of Albany's Book of Golden Deeds Award.
