William C. Stewart, 86, a retired Civil Service officer, formerly of Vienna, VA, died after a period of declining health Feb. 14 at Phoebe Putney Memorial Hospital in Albany, GA. The family will receive friends 6 PM to 8 PM (today), Sunday February 17, 2008 at Kimbrell-Stern Funeral Directors, with a prayer service at 7:15 PM. Bill, as he was known, was born in Valentine, NE, where he graduated from Valentine High School as class valedictorian. After serving in the United States Navy during WWII, he enrolled at Georgetown University and graduated from the School of Foreign Service there. He retired after a 25-year career that included overseas assignments in Germany and Vietnam from the Civil Service in 1976. After retirement he obtained a Master's Degree in Linguistics from George Washington University and subsequently enjoyed teaching English as a second language to students of many nationalities in Arlington, VA. For many years before moving to Albany, GA, in 2001 he spent summers in Fredericksburg, VA, and the rest of the year in Fort Myers, FL. Survivors include, the love of his life, his wife of 61 years, Elizabeth B. Stewart; one son, Jay Stewart and wife, Nancy, of Asheville, NC; three daughters, Deborah Naquin and husband, Doug, of Ashburn, VA; Patty Underdahl and husband, Ron, of Albany, GA, and Helen Banks and husband, Jim, of Calabasas, CA; five grandchildren, Kelly Underdahl Powell, Brian Underdahl, Ronnie Underdahl, Kaely Naquin Davis and Julie Naquin. He was a loving husband, father and grandfather who will be missed and long remembered for his unflinching devotion to his country, his faith and his family. In
