November 21, 1918 - April 7, 2004

An Albany native, Mr. Williams was a member of the First Baptist Church. He was a co-founder of the Jail House Ministry, and also volunteered for many organizations. He graduated from Albany High School in 1935, attended Emory at Oxford, Emory University and graduated from the University of Georgia in 1940. He joined the US Army Air Corp and graduated from Army Flying School in 1941. He served in World War II, the Korean Conflict and Viet Nam and received the Silver Star. He enjoyed hunting and fishing and his favorite saying was "I'd rather be at Bullneck, AKA, God's Country. He was preceded in death by a daughter, Elizabeth "Cissie" Williams.
